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Studied Population The study population comprised a range of healthcare workers working in selected health facilities. This study was carried out in the major hospitals which limit generalizability to small and rural health facilities. The quantitative data generated was entered in Epidata 3. In addition, data was collected on the occupational health and safety practice. For example, people working in the medical equipment maintenance, mechanical maintenance, building and grounds maintenance, food service, laundry, housekeeping, and administrative staff have reported nonfatal injuries and illnesses in the workplace.
